Fr. Jason's Wishful Thinking: Christmas Updates & Fireworks Sale

As we get closer to Christmas, I wanted to update you on three projects that I have been working on behind the scenes.

(1) Many people have been wondering about my Christmas village display, which is a 33-year tradition in my family. This year, it has been very difficult to get it ready, as everything was moved from French Settlement to Central, and it is like putting together a three-dimensional puzzle. I have been having to hunt for pieces each time that I have a few hours in the evening to work on it before going to bed. You will only be able to see 1/3 of the village this year. We'll work on the other scenes of the Christmas village for next year when I am more settled.

(2) Right now, I am quite busy with annulment work. If you have called me for help with your annulment, please know that I have not forgotten about you... but I invest about eight hours of time into each one, and this time is spread over a few appointments with each person that I am helping. I have 13 of them on my desk right now at various stages of preparation to be sent to the Tribunal. So please be patient with me if you are wanting to work on an annulment.

(3) Finally, I want to tell you about my obsession with fireworks. Fourteen years ago, I began a fireworks sale at St. Joseph Church in French Settlement to help pay off the construction debt on their new church built in 2006. We paid it off six years early; and since then, the fireworks sale has allowed us to accomplish several other large building projects, including a whole building just for the fireworks sale (which is climate-controlled).

I see this fundraiser as a way that can benefit our church & school, too... Perhaps fireworks are part of your family traditions surrounding holidays. East Baton Rouge Parish has strict laws about the sale, delivery, and discharge of fireworks within the parish, but I can offer you the ability to purchase them through St. Joseph Church in French Settlement and also coordinate delivery of your purchase on the Livingston Parish side of Magnolia Beach bridge.

When we started this fundraiser, we decided to price our fireworks with a 114% mark-up, when the normal profit margin is 200-300%. Some stands have certain "loss leaders" advertised to get you into the store or tent (e.g. "Buy 1, Get 3 Free"). At St. Joseph, we believe in selling ALL of our fireworks with a consistent profit margin so it is all transparent, and the price includes the sales tax, merchant transaction fees (for credit/debit card purchases), and the transportation costs from our wholesalers. Therefore, I estimate that you will save between 30-40% on your fireworks if you purchase through St. Joseph Church. If you don't believe me, feel free to bring our price sheet to any fireworks vendor or online merchant and compare.

Meanwhile, 42% of your total purchase price will go to St. Alphonsus School (or the church, if you prefer). The school is not taxed the same way that the church is taxed on fundraising income. Ordering with us is simple.

(1) Mark the quantity desired on the price sheet that you will find in the Gather Space or through the school memo. (2) Fill out the contact information on page two.

(3) Take a clear picture of both pages and send it via text to (225) 205-4757.

(4) I will contact you with any discrepancies/shortages, arrange payment (we take cash, credit cards, Venmo, etc.) and also schedule a delivery time with you. We will meet on the Livingston Parish side of the Amite River for delivery.

Thank you for your consideration and openness to this creative way of fundraising. If you would like to help with the fireworks sale, please call me at (225) 205-4757. As this will be our first Christmas/New Year doing this as a joint venture, please be patient as we work out the inventory and supply needs. I see this as a great cooperative venture between St. Joseph & St. Alphonsus for years to come.

Featured Saint of the Week St. Lorenzo Ruiz (1600–1637) Feast Day: September 28

Lorenzo was born in Manila of mixed heritage; his mother was Filipino and his father was of Chinese descent. Both of his parents were devout converts to Christianity, instilling the same devotion and values into their son.



Lorenzo worked at his local parish church, and he also had a government job. As a respected member of the community, he had a wife and three children, plus he was an active member of the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary, a lay organization.

In 1636 he was implicated in the murder of a Spaniard. The police issued a warrant for his arrest, but because of his heritage, Lorenzo was quite concerned that he would not be treated justly.

Knowing that some priests were leaving the country, Lorenzo and 3 Dominican priests boarded a ship that he thought was headed to Macau, a Portuguese colony in China. Unfortunately, the ship's actual destination was Japan. Upon their arrival, they were immediately arrested for the crime of being Christians. Christianity had recently become illegal in Japan, and the government was heavily involved in hellish persecutions.

The 4 men endured hideous tortures; then the government offered freedom if they would renounce their faith. Lorenzo's response was: "I am a Christian and this I profess until the hour of my death and for God I will give my life..."

A year later Lorenzo along with his priest friends were bound, and hanged upside down. This too had a special intentionally tortuous aspect, in that it would take at least 2 days of excruciating pain before they would succumb to death.

Lorenzo was about 37 when he died; he is the first Filipino saint and martyr. When canonized in 1987, it was the first time a canonization ceremony took place outside of the Vatican.
