Holy Water

In the Catholic Church, holy water is a sacramental (holy sign) that reminds us of our initial baptism; becoming a member of the family of God.

Wearing the vestment stole, in conjunction with the authority of Christ, a bishop, priest, or deacon can bestow blessings to make holy water.

When you dip your finger into the holy water, and make the sign of the cross, whether upon entering or exiting the Church, you are touching your forehead (mind) and your shoulders (crossing your heart) with a sacramental. If this simple action is performed in faith, it imparts grace to the believer.

Our church fonts contain holy water comprised of both water and salt each blessed, then combined. Holy water may be kept in a font at home (recommended), and like that in the church, by signing ourselves and/or our children, we can make use of the means of grace to help us lead a pious Christian life.

Lent is a particularly solemn time for Catholics. During the Triduum, we see the holy water fonts emptied from just after the Mass on Holy Thursday, until the Saturday Easter Vigil Mass. By doing this we are acknowledging our spiritual emptiness without Christ in our lives; from his death until his resurrection.

It is important to note, that since holy water is a sacramental (holy sign) it should be disposed of with reverence. It can be poured directly into the soil. Another option is to pour it into the sacrarium (sink) in the sacristy, which has a drain pipe that empties directly into the soil. It should NEVER be put into or through a public water/sewage system.

As a side note, although the process and/or usages may not be exactly the same, other faiths also use holy water. They are: Lutheranism, Anglicanism, Eastern Orthodoxy, and Oriental Orthodoxy.

In the Diocese of Baton Rouge, all Catholics are bound by the laws of fasting and abstinence during Lent.

Catholics aged 18 through 59 are obligated to follow the law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating only one full meatless meal a day. Taking two other small meals that together do not equal a full meal is permitted. Food and drink "between meals" (except water) is not permitted.

Catholics aged 14 and up are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. Abstinence means to abstain from eating meat. Eggs, milk products, or condiments made from animal fat are allowed.


