Featured Saints of the Week

St. Nunzio Sulprizio (1817-1836) Feast Day: May 5

Nunzio's birth was a bright light to his family who had been dealing with widespread famine and a number of family deaths. His family was devoutly Catholic and had Nunzio baptized on the day he was born. His father died while Nunzio was a toddler, so his widowed mother, needing stability, married a much older man.

Nunzio attended a school run by the local priest; he developed a lifelong love for the Mass, and stories about the lives of the Saints. Unfortunately, his mother died paving the way for his stepfather to send him away. He was uprooted a number of times among family and friends; for a short period he even worked as a blacksmith apprentice.

One morning Nunzio awoke with a leg so swollen that he couldn't stand on it. He had a number of hospital stays; his uncle Francisco, an army soldier was caring for him at this time. His uncle arranged for him to meet future saint Gaetano Enrico, who founded the religious order, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary, in Naples, Italy. He promised Nunzio a place in the Order.

Nunzio's medical progress was waning. He was admitted to the Hospital for Incurables. While there he comforted others, taught prayers and the Catechism; he was also preparing to receive First Eucharist. (You had to be 15 to receive it.)

His leg became septic and had to be amputated. Despite his life's tribulations, he never lost his pleasant disposition and spiritual devotion. In March 1836, because of his steadily declining health, he asked to receive the last Sacraments of the Church. Two months later in May, he asked for a crucifix to hold. He died at age 19, while praying and embracing the crucifix.

For the five days of his funeral, the smell of roses surrounded his body.
